Aqua's locator mismarked the line by approximately 4 feet by their own admission, and Utility Line Services did not find the line when they excavated test holes to ensure that their pneuma-gopher piercing tool did not strike any underground lines. Even though the line was not located, ULS shot the pneumatic missile in the direction of the marks. Philipsburg began digging on 5/11 which is later than the date they expected to begin excavation, but still within the 10 business days that the law allows excavation to begin. According to Philipsburg Plumbing and Heating’s AVR they believed they were 10 feet away from Penelec’s line. Due to the line being mis-marked they struck the line with a backhoe. Penelec sent a crew out to repair the line.</p> <p>Due to the downtime incurred by Philipsburg Plumbing and Heating as a result of the line-strike, the homeowner was billed \$627.20 more than the original \$300-400 they were expecting this project to cost. Aqua’s AVR states that the main was mismarked by 3 feet. PECO’s AVR states that the print the locator was using was incorrect because the landmarks that were used to locate the lines have changed from when the map was originally created (the roadway had been widened sometime between the time the map was created and when the locator marked the line), and PECO admits that the line was marked incorrectly.
