# ACT 127-GAS & HAZARDOUS LIQUIDS PIPELINES ACT

- Governor Corbett signed on 12/22/11, the Gas and Hazardous Liquids Pipelines Act, Act 127 of 2011. The Act provides authority to the Commission to enforce Federal pipeline safety laws as they relate to non-public utility gas and hazardous liquids pipeline equipment and facilities within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The Act enables the Commission to fund an increase in its complement of pipeline safety inspectors by assessments to be paid by Pennsylvania pipeline operators.
