- Petition Requesting a Hearing for the Purpose of Allocating Costs Associated for a Rail-Highway Crossing Project filed on 5/8/12. The Commission had previously approved, by Secretarial Letter dated 3/5/10, an Application to replace the superstructure of an existing bridge over a single track. The Commission ordered that, upon completion of the project, a hearing would be scheduled to determine any issues regarding allocation of construction costs. Columbia's Petition requested a hearing to determine the allocation of costs between itself and PennDOT. A Recommended Decision was issued on 10/17/13 in which the ALJ denied Columbia's request for reimbursement of its costs, and allocated all costs incurred by Columbia as a result of the bridge replacement, to Columbia. On 11/6/13, Columbia filed Exceptions to the Recommended Decision and PennDOT filed Replies to Exceptions on 11/18/13.

- The Commission is required to submit a report to the Senate Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committee and the House Consumer Affairs Committee. 66 Pa.C.S. § 2806.1(i)(2). To meet this requirement, the Commission directed the SWE to provide a comprehensive Phase I Final Annual Report, to be filed in lieu of a program year 4 (PY4) annual report. In addition to outlining its audit activities and findings for PY4, the SWE was to review the EDCs' PY4 Final Annual Reports and its own auditing information to determine whether or not the consumption and peak demand reductions reported by the EDCs were accurate. The Commission must also determine whether the EDCs are in compliance with the requirements outlined at 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 2806.1(b), (c) and (d). With this Order, the Commission releases the SWE's Phase I Final Annual Report and assesses the EDCs compliance with reduction requirements.

This electronic filing requirement was implemented for a 1-year pilot period which was later extended for an additional year. Having become satisfied with our procedures regarding the electronic submission of testimony, the Commission initiates this rulemaking to propose regulations regarding the procedures to be followed for the electronic submission of testimony.
