Application of Dash Energy, LLC for Approval to Offer, Render, Furnish Re: or Supply Electric Generation Services as a Broker/Marketer Docket No. A-2010-2201567

Dear Secretary Chiavetta:

By this letter, Dash Energy, LLC ("Dash") is hereby requesting an amendment to its Electric Generation Supplier license to permit Dash to perform broker/marketer services for residential customers.

By Order entered November 22, 2010 (a copy of which is enclosed herewith), the Commission approved Dash's Application to provide EGS services as a Broker/Marketer for industrial, governmental, and large (over 25 kw demand) and small (25 kw and under) commercial customers. The Commission's Order stated that "If Dash chooses to provide broker/marketer services to residential customers in the future, however, Dash must file a request for a license modification with the Commission Secretary by letter immediately and be required to comply with, and be governed by, applicable Chapter 56 residential service regulations as set forth in the Commission Order Guidelines for Maintaining Customer Service at the Same Level of Quality Pursuant to 66 Pa. C.S. § 2807(d), and Assuring Conformance with 52 Pa. Code Chapter 56 Pursuant to 66 Pa. C.S. § 2809(e) and (f) at Docket No. M-00960890 F0011, Order entered July 11, 1997." This letter is being filed in accordance with the Commission's Order.

Dash proposes to serve residential customers in the same manner that it serves its current customers. Dash will not function as a supplier or aggregator nor will it participate in any physical or operational function involving electric supply. Dash will take no title to electricity or make or process utility payments on behalf of their customers. As CEO of Dash, I hereby verify that Dash will comply with the applicable Chapter 56 residential service regulations.

At the time of filing its initial Application, Dash published notice of the Application in all of the required newspapers of general circulation. It is important to note that Dash's publication notices did not specify any classes of customers to be served. Therefore, Dash respectfully submits that its initial publications served to provide notice to the public of its operations, and therefore Dash requests that no second publication be required by the Commission in connection with the within license modification request.

Dash also requests that no additional bond be required by the Commission. As Dash indicated in its original application. Dash will not be collecting any gross receipts from its

customers or generating electricity. Also, Dash will not make electric utility payments on behalf of its customers. Dash services are solely to act as a marketer/broker engaged in the business of negotiating the purchase of electricity for commercial, industrial and governmental consumers of electricity. The Commission granted Dash's request to allow a posting of a \$10,000 bond in connection with its original EGS approval, and Dash requests that the Commission maintain this level of bonding if it approves Dash's request to modify its license to include residential customers.


