BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING

Aqua Pennsylvania, Inc. (Aqua) has issued a precautionary boil water advisory for customers in Clarendon Borough and parts of Mead Township effective immediately due to the loss of water pressure as a result of a water main break this morning. Areas of Mead Township that are affected include customers on: Route 6 South of Dutchman Run Road; Chapman Dam Road East of FR 438 and Route 6 North of Garfield Hill Road.

What should I do?

DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST. Bring all water to a boil, let it boil for one minute, and let it cool before using, or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, washing dishes, and food preparation. Boiling kills bacteria and other organisms in the water.

This situation may have increased the risk for the presence of disease-causing organisms in your water. These organisms include bacteria, viruses and parasites, which can cause diarrhea, cramps, nausea, headaches, or other symptoms. They may pose a special health risk for infants, young children, some of the elderly and people with severely compromised immune systems. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers.

Organisms in drinking water are not the only potential sources of these symptoms. If you experience any of these symptoms, you may want to seek medical advice. People at increased risk should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers.

What happened? What is being done?

A main break occurred in Clarendon Borough on Monday morning, March 14, 2011 near 243 N. Main Street. Customers in the area identified above might have experienced or continue to experience problems with their water service while repairs are made. Water samples are being collected today. As a precaution, Aqua is issuing a boil water advisory effective immediately until the results of bacteriological samples are received from the laboratory. We expect to have results Wednesday, March 16, 2010. Updates will be available on our web site at www.aquapennsylvania.com.
