# JOINT PETITION TO INTERVENE OF THE MET-ED INDUSTRIAL USERS GROUP, THE PENELEC INDUSTRIAL CUSTOMER ALLIANCE, THE PENN POWER USERS GROUP, AND THE WEST PENN POWER INDUSTRIAL INTERVENORS

TO THE HONORABLE, THE PENNSYLVANIA PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION:

Pursuant to Sections 5.71 through 5.74 of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's ("PUC" or "Commission") Regulations, 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.71-5.74, the Med-Ed Industrial Users Group ("MEIUG"), the Penelec Industrial Customer Alliance ("PICA"), the Penn Power Users Group ("PPUG"), and the West Penn Power Industrial Intervenors ("WPPII") (collectively, "Industrial Customer Groups") hereby file this Joint Petition to Intervene in the above-captioned proceeding. In support thereof, the Industrial Customer Groups state as follows:

1. Petitioners are MEIUG, PICA, PPUG, and WPPII. The compositions of MEIUG, PICA, PPUG, and WPPII are attached hereto as Appendix A, Appendix B, Appendix C, and Appendix D, respectively. MEIUG, PICA, PPUG, and WPPII reserve the right to modify these Appendices throughout the course of this proceeding, as necessary.

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- 3. On August 3, 2012, the Commission issued its Energy Efficiency and Conservation ("EE&C") Phase II Implementation Order ("I.O.") at Docket Nos. M-2012-2289411 and M-2008-2069887, tentatively adopting, among other things, Electric Distribution Company ("EDC")-specific consumption reduction targets for the period June 1, 2013, through May 31, 2016. The I.O. indicated that an EDC could contest its specific targets by filing a petition for evidentiary hearing by August 20, 2012. If the EDC did not contest, the target would become final. In addition, the I.O. noted that parties could submit petitions to intervene within ten days of an EDC filing a petition for evidentiary hearing.
- 4. On August 20, 2012, Metropolitan Edison Company ("Met-Ed"), Pennsylvania Electric Company ("Penelec"), Pennsylvania Power Company ("Penn Power"), and West Penn Power Company ("West Penn") (collectively, "Companies") submitted to the Commission a Joint Petition for an Evidentiary Hearing challenging the energy efficiency ("EE") benchmarks established in the LO. ("Joint Petition"). Specifically, the Companies indicated that they cannot be certain if these energy efficiency benchmarks can be achieved until after certain assessments

occur. In order to preserve their rights to challenge the energy efficiency benchmarks set forth in the I.O., the Companies submitted their Petition.

- 5. The Industrial Customer Groups are <u>ad hoc</u> associations of energy-intensive commercial and industrial customers receiving electric service in the Companies' service territories. As some of the Companies' largest customers, whose manufacturing processes require significant amounts of electricity, any proposed modifications to the Companies' EE&C Plans could significantly impact the Industrial Customer Groups' production costs. Accordingly, if the Companies determine, after the proposed assessments, that these benchmarks are not appropriate and seek modifications, the Industrial Customers Groups must preserve their ability to fully participate in any such evidentiary hearings.
- 6. Therefore, consistent with 52 Pa. Code § 5.72(a), the Industrial Customer Groups have a significant interest in this proceeding that is not represented by any other party of record. Accordingly, the Industrial Customer Groups should be granted intervenor status in this proceeding.

WHEREFORE, the Met-Ed Industrial Users Group, the Penelec Industrial Customer Alliance, the Penn Power Users Group, and the West Penn Power Industrial Intervenors respectfully request that the Commission grant this Joint Petition to Intervene and provide the Met-Ed Industrial Users Group, the Penelec Industrial Customer Alliance, the Penn Power Users Group, and the West Penn Power Industrial Intervenors with full-party status in this proceeding.
