On August 7, 1998, Jack Rich, Incorporated filed an application with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission ("PUC") for a license to supply electricity as (1) a supplier of electric power, (2) a broker/market engaged in the business of supplying electricity, and (3) an aggregator engaged in the business of supplying electricity.
