- 9. By a Secretarial Letter dated December 7, 2011, PPL Electric was served with a Complaint filed by Joe & Vanessa Caparo at Docket No. C-2011-2276731 ("Caparo Complaint"). The Caparo Complaint raises issues related to the siting and route selection of the proposed transmission lines associated with the Northeast-Pocono Reliability Project.
- 10. By Secretarial Letter dated May 18, 2012, PPL Electric was served with the Formal Complaint filed by Christopher and Melinda Maros at Docket No. C-2012-2305047 ("Maros Complaint"). The Maros Complaint raises issues related to the siting and route selection of the proposed transmission lines associated with the Northeast-Pocono Reliability Project.
- 11. By Prehearing Order No. 1, issued January 8, 2013, Administrative Law Judge David A. Salapa consolidated the North Pocono Zoning Petition and West Pocono Zoning Petition with the Siting Application, at Docket No. A-2012-2340872, for purposes of discovery, litigation, and disposition.
- 12. On January 25, 2013, PPL Electric filed a motion to consolidate the thirty-seven Eminent Domain Applications, Maros Complaint, and Caparo Complaint with the Siting Application, North Pocono Zoning Petition, and West Pocono Zoning Petition. By Prehearing

- Order No. 2, issued January 29, 2013, Administrative Law Judge David A. Salapa granted the motion to consolidate.
- 13. On February 27, 2013, the Office of Consumer Advocate filed a Notice of Intervention and Public Statement.
- 14. Pursuant to the Prehearing Order No. 1, protests and petitions to intervene were required to be filed on or before February 27, 2013. As of the date of this Prehearing Memorandum, timely protests and/or petitions to intervene were served on PPL Electric by the following non-statutory parties: Blue Ridge Real Estate Company; Covington Township; North Pocono Citizens Alert Regarding the Environment; Transcontinental Gas Pipe Line Company, LLC; US Industrial Reit II; FR First Avenue Property Holding, LP; FR E2 Property Holding, LP; Bradley D. Hummel; John C. and Linda S. Justice; Ronald G. and Gloria Sidovar; and Pennsylvania Glacial Till, LLC.²
- 15. Notices of appearance were also entered on behalf of Lawrence Duda and John F. and Veronica B. Iskra. These individuals have not filed a protest or formally intervened in this matter.
- 16. On February 13, 2013, PPL Electric filed a petition for leave to withdraw and terminate the Application of PPL Electric Utilities Corporation to Exercise the Power of Eminent Domain to Acquire an Easement and Right-of-Way Across the Property of Merel J. and Arlene J. Swingle, at Docket No. A-2013-2341250. Said petition to withdraw is pending for disposition.

- 17. On February 20, 2013, the Covington Township filed a Request for Waiver to File Answer and New Matter. PPL Electric filed a Response to the New Matter on February 28, 2013.
- 18. On March 1, 2013, PPL Electric filed a petition for leave to withdraw and terminate the Application of PPL Electric Utilities Corporation to Exercise the Power of Eminent Domain to Acquire an Easement and Right-of-Way Across the Property of Christopher Maros and Melinda Maros, at Docket No. A-2013-2341213. Said petition to withdraw is pending for disposition.³

III. ISSUES

- 19. PPL Electric intends to demonstrate that the siting and construction of the proposed Northeast-Pocono Reliability Project in portions of Luzerne, Lackawanna, Monroe, and Wayne Counties, Pennsylvania is reasonably necessary to resolve projected reliability and planning violations and to reinforce the 138/69 kV system in Carbon, Lackawanna, Luzerne, Monroe, Pike, and Wayne Counties by bringing a new 230 kV supply source closer to the growing load centers. To accomplish this, PPL Electric proposes to locate the new West Pocono and North Pocono 230-69 kV Substations central to the loads they will serve. The new Substations will be connected to the existing 230 kV transmission systems by building an approximately 58-mile new 230 kV transmission line. The new Substations will be connected to the existing local 138/69 kV transmission systems by building approximately 11.3 miles of new 138/69 kV transmission lines.
- 20. PPL Electric intends to demonstrate that the proposed routes for the 230 kV and 138/69 kV transmission lines for the Northeast-Pocono Reliability Project were selected after extensive public input and a detailed analysis, which included a comprehensive environmental

inventory, identification and analysis of alternative routes, and selection of the preferred routes. PPL Electric will demonstrate that it identified and compared route alternatives based upon a detailed analysis and balance of comments from the public, societal concerns, environmental impacts, engineering considerations, and cost. PPL Electric intends to demonstrate that, overall, the preferred routes will have substantially less impact on the natural and built environments, land use, and citizens in the Northeast Pocono region than alternative routes would have.

- 21. PPL Electric intends to demonstrate that the construction of the proposed West Pocono 230-69 kV Substation in Buck Township and the proposed North Pocono 230-69 kV Substation in Covington Township, including the control equipment buildings, is necessary for the service, accommodation, convenience, or safety of the public. PPL Electric intends to demonstrate that the new West Pocono and North Pocono 230-69 kV Substations will be located centrally to the loads they will serve. PPL Electric intends to show that the two new Substations and associated new transmission lines will reduce the distance between the supply of power and the homes and businesses that use the electricity, which will reduce the number of customers affected by a single facility outage, as well as the duration of the outage. PPL Electric also intends to demonstrate that it will consider and adopt all reasonable suggestions from local governments, including Buck and Covington Townships, to the extent that they can be implemented at a reasonable cost and that they do not interfere with the construction or effective operation of the proposed facilities.
- 22. PPL Electric intends to demonstrate that its proposed exercise of the power of eminent domain to acquire rights-of-way and easements for the construction, operation and maintenance of the proposed Northeast-Pocono Reliability Project over certain portions of the lands identified in the Eminent Domain Applications is necessary or proper for the service, accommodation, convenience, or safety of the public. The preferred routes for the transmission

lines associated with the proposed Northeast-Pocono Reliability Project cross the tracts of land identified in the Eminent Domain Applications. PPL Electric intends to show that the service to be furnished by PPL Electric through the proposed and related facilities is necessary or proper to resolve reliability and planning violations and to reinforce the 138/69 kV systems serving the Northeast Pocono regions by bringing a new 230 kV supply source closer to the growing load centers.

To the extent that the parties are agreeable to the use of a secured website for purposes of discovery, PPL Electric proposes to establish and maintain the website for the convenience of all parties.

VI. <u>LITIGATION SCHEDULE</u>

27. PPL Electric is prepared to discuss the litigation schedule with the parties at the Prehearing Conference. To the extent that the parties are unable to agree on a schedule, PPL Electric proposes that the following schedule set forth in the Prehearing Order No. 1 be adopted for resolution of this proceeding:
