

**JOINT MOTION OF ALL ACTIVE PARTIES FOR ADMISSION  
OF TESTIMONY AND EXHIBITS INTO EVIDENCE**

**TO ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE JOEL H. CHESKIS:**

Columbia Gas of Pennsylvania (“Columbia” or the “Company”), the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (“I&E”) of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”), the Office of Consumer Advocate (“OCA”), the Office of Small Business Advocate (“OSBA”), and the Columbia Industrial Intervenors (“CII”), all parties to the above-captioned proceeding (hereinafter collectively referred to as the “Parties”), file this Motion for the Admission of Testimony and Exhibits into Evidence in the above-captioned proceeding (the “Motion for Admission”). In support of the Motion for Admission, the Parties represent as follows:

1. On February 28, 2013, Columbia filed with the Commission the pre-filing data required under the Commission’s regulations concerning annual changes to rates for the recovery of purchased gas costs. That pre-filing data reflected a proposed decrease of \$0.00412/Therm from Columbia’s then-effective rate for recovery of purchased gas costs (“PGC”) to sales customers. On April 1, 2013, Columbia filed with the Commission Supplement No. 199 to Tariff Gas - Pa. P.U.C. No. 9, to become effective for service rendered on and after October 1,

2013. In Supplement No. 199, Columbia proposed a decrease in its rates for recovery of purchased gas costs of \$0.00412/Therm.

2. Supplement No. 199 was docketed by the Commission at Docket No. R-2013-2351073 and was assigned to Administrative Law Judge Joel H. Cheskis (“ALJ”). Timely complaints and/or notices of intervention were filed by I&E, OCA, and OSBA. In addition, CII filed a Petition to Intervene on March 28, 2013.

3. An initial prehearing conference was held before the ALJ on April 15, 2013. The Parties who participated in the prehearing conference filed prehearing memoranda identifying potential issues and witnesses. A litigation schedule was established at the initial prehearing conference.

4. The Parties undertook formal and informal discovery prior and subsequent to the initial prehearing conference, and submitted direct and rebuttal testimony and exhibits in accordance with the procedural schedule.

5. The Parties held several settlement conferences. As a result of these conferences and the efforts of the Parties to examine the issues raised in this proceeding, a Settlement in Principle of all issues was achieved prior to the date scheduled for the submission of surrebuttal testimony.

6. On June 6, 2013, the Parties informed the ALJ of the Settlement in Principle.

7. On June 7, 2013, the ALJ suspended the litigation schedule.

8. The Joint Petition for Settlement was filed with the Commission and submitted to the ALJ on July 1, 2013.

9. The Parties believe that the testimony and exhibits that have been submitted in this proceeding will facilitate the consideration of the settlement petition by the ALJ and the Commission because the testimony and exhibits address the issues resolved by the settlement

petition. Therefore, the Parties hereby move that the following testimony and exhibits submitted in this proceeding be marked and admitted into evidence.






