PREPARED TESTIMONY OF MARY ANN NOGA VALSPAR CORPORATION

My name is Mary Ann Noga. I am the Traffic Manager for Valspar Corporation at its facilities located at 2000 Westhall Street, Pittsburgh, PA 15233. I have been employed by the Company for 27 years and have held the position of Traffic Manager for the past 12 years. In my position, I am fully familiar with and responsible for the transportation of inbound and outbound traffic. I am authorized to appear in support of this application of Central Transport, Inc. I have reviewed documentation furnished to me by Central concerning that carrier's participation in traffic moving inbound to facilities of Valspar at Rochester and Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania during the period October 1987 through September 1988, as well as outbound traffic from those facilities.

During that period, Central transported seven (7) shipments inbound to Rochester from origins in Alabama, Georgia and South Carolina; and four (4) shipments inbound to Pittsburgh from points in Georgia and New Jersey.

During the same period, Central transported twenty (20) loads outbound from Pittsburgh and 318 loads outbound from Rochester. The twenty loads from Pittsburgh were split between destinations in Alabama (14 loads) and destinations in Indiana (6 loads). The 318 loads from Rochester were destined to the following states:
