

On November 30, 2012 Eco-Energy, Inc. (FEIN: 62-1722312), a TN S-Corporation, converted to a Single Member Limited Liability Company thus becoming Eco-Energy, LLC ("Eco-Energy"). Due to its status as a disregarded entity for Federal Tax purposes (before and after the conversion) its FEIN remained the same. As of November 30, 2012 Eco-Energy was owned 100% by LBDB Holdings, Inc. ("LBDB"). On December 7, 2012 LBDB reorganized its business structure and created a new 100% wholly owned subsidiary named Eco-Energy Global Biofuels, LLC ("EEGB") (FEIN: 80-0870994) and assigned all corporate assets and equity interests (Including 100% of Eco-Energy) to this company. On December 8, 2012 LBDB then sold a 1% interest in EEGB to Larry Beckwith (controlling owner of LBDB). On December 18, 2012 LBDB Holdings, Inc. sold a 65% ownership interest in EEGB to Copersucar North America, LLC (FEIN: 46-1464888) and a 1.5% interest to Chad Martin (CEO of Eco-Energy). Exhibit 4c: Proposed Services

Immediate plans for operations in Pennsylvania include partnering with Pennsylvania producers and either exporting supply for sale in neighboring states or selling directly to customers within the state who have in-house owned pipelines which tap into interstate pipelines. The company's intended customer base will exist predominately of large industrial users. Considering that neither scenario for immediate plans utilizes the jurisdictional facilities of a natural gas distribution company, no license is required.

However, Eco-Energy does intend to provide additional services which do utilize the jurisdictional facilities of a natural gas distribution company in the near future. Eco-Energy will take title to the gas in PA and deliver to the client's specified utility. In this scenario, the clients are comprised of those who manage their own utility risk and simply prefer to buy wholesale supply. Arrangements between Eco-Energy and the utilities for pooling purposes are likely not necessary because the client will be responsible for any credit relationships with the utility. The client will be setup with the utility, take title to the gas at the city gate, and transport to the burner tip.

Furthermore, potential future services may include the delivery of gas to utility interconnects via interstate or intrastate pipelines. In this scenario, Eco-Energy will hold a credit position with the utility and manage the exposure between clients and the utility. Any penalties will be assessed to Eco-Energy and the onus to collect those from the clients will be between Eco-Energy and the client.

Under all previously outlined proposed services, Eco-Energy will manage all client credit risk, utility balancing and pools, and the invoicing of clients. The typical billing cycle will be net 10 billed by the 15th of the following month with terms depending on the credit viability of the client. Deal contracts will range in duration from 1 month to 2 years.



(Issued December 16, 2014)

On November 13, 2014, Eco-Energy, LLC (Eco-Energy), filed an application with the Utilities Board (Board) for a certificate to provide service as a competitive natural gas provider (CNGP) to large volume customers in Iowa. Board rules at 19.14 establish the filing requirements for an application for a CNGP certificate. Subrule 19.14(4) provides that an applicant will be notified when its application is complete and the 90-day review period begins. On November 17, 2014, the Board notified Eco-Energy that the application was complete and the 90-day review period had begun. The 90-day deadline for granting a certificate to Eco-Energy is February 15, 2015.

On December 3, 2014, the Consumer Advocate Division of the Department of Justice (Consumer Advocate) filed a response to Eco-Energy's application for a certificate. In the response, Consumer Advocate indicated that it did not object to the application.

lowa Code § 476.87 requires that an applicant for a CNGP certificate must reasonably demonstrate that it has the managerial, technical, and financial capability sufficient to obtain and deliver the services it proposes to offer. Subrule 199 IAC 19.14(3) describes the basic information that is required to be provided by an applicant for a CNGP certificate. The Board also has developed application forms that describe additional information that must be provided depending on the type of CNGP service that is proposed to be provided.

In support of its application to provide CNGP services to large volume customers, Eco-Energy provided the following information:

- (1) Eco-Energy is a limited liability company organized in the state of Tennessee.
- (2) Eco-Energy attached a copy of its Certificate of Authority to transact business in the state of Iowa.
- (3) Eco-Energy provided the contact information for its principal officers and the telephone number at which Eco-Energy personnel can be reached 24 hours a day.
- (4) Eco-Energy has no affiliates engaged in the provision of competitive natural gas services in Iowa or any other state.
- (5) Eco-Energy has not had a license or certificate to supply competitive natural gas services suspended, revoked, or denied in any other state or jurisdiction. In addition, there are no legal actions regarding competitive natural gas service pending against Eco-Energy.

(6) Eco-Energy made a commitment to comply with all applicable conditions of certification, including a requirement to file an annual report and notifying the Board within 14 days of any significant changes in the corporations operations.

Eco-Energy acknowledged that a failure to comply with all of the applicable conditions of certification may result in the revocation of the CNGP certificate.

Based upon the above information, the Board finds that Eco-Energy has reasonably demonstrated that it has the managerial, technical, and financial capability sufficient to obtain and deliver CNGP services to large volume customers in Iowa. If Eco-Energy chooses to serve small volume CNGP customers in the future, the company must file the additional information required to obtain a certificate to serve small volume customers as described on the application form on the Board's Web site. Eco-Energy must receive an amended certificate before beginning service to small volume customers.

Since the Board has found that Eco-Energy has provided sufficient information to meet the requirements in Iowa Code § 476.87 and Board requirements, the Board will grant Eco-Energy a CNGP certificate to provide service to large volume customers in Iowa. Certificate No. G-0039 will be issued concurrently with this order.
