OBJECTION OF AUTOCAB, INC. TO APPLICATION FOR SUBPOENA OF GREG VANNUCCI

AND NOW, comes Autocab, Inc., ("Protestant Autocab") and, pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.421(f) objects to the Application of Amigo Cab, LLC ("Applicant Amigo Cab") for Subpoena of Greg Vannucci as follows:

- This proceeding concerns the Application of Amigo Cab, filed with the Public 1. Utility Commission ("Commission") on or about March 16, 2015, to provide call or demand service in Berks and Lancaster Counties.
- Protestant Autocab provides call or demand service in Lancaster County and filed 2. a timely Protest to the Application on June 3, 2015.
- 3. On or about August 19, 2015, Applicant Amigo Cab filed an Application for Subpoena of Greg Vannucci to require his appearance at hearing on September 9, 2015.1 In support of the Application, Applicant Amigo Cab averred as follows:

The hearing of September 9, 2015 has been continued until a later date by Prehearing Order of Administrative Law Judge Buckley dated August 31, 2015.

Protestant Autocab asserts in its Protest that there is no public need for the service proposed by Applicant and that entry of Applicant's proposed service into the local market would endanger or impair the operations of existing carriers. The Applicant requests that Mr. Vannucci appear and testify to the sufficiency of call and demand service in the area and any alleged adverse effect that the entry of a new service would have on his business or other existing carriers. Mr. Vannucci's testimony is materially relevant to the proceeding because he is the Chief Financial Officer of Autocab, the sole protestant in the proceeding, thus he is one of the only qualified individuals who has first hand knowledge of the effect of a new call or demand service on Autocab and other existing carriers. Furthermore, Mr. Vannucci is the individual who verified the averments set forth in Autocab's Protest and Applicant requests the opportunity to cross examine him about those averments.

- 4. Applicant Amigo Cab also filed Applications for Subpoenas to require the appearance of Mr. Timothy J. Schwartz, President of Protestant Autocab, and Mr. John A. Schwartz, Vice President of Autocab, at the hearing on September 9, 2015. The averred justification for their appearance is identical in all material respects to the averred justification for Mr. Vannucci's appearance.
- 5. Protestant Autocab intends to present Mr. Timothy J. Schwartz as a witness at the hearing.² With the appearance of Mr. Schwartz, the appearance of Mr. Vannucci is not necessary for Applicant's purposes at hearing and Applicant Amigo Cab has presented nothing that suggests otherwise. The Application for Subpoena acknowledges that Mr. Vannucci is "one of the only qualified individuals who has first-hand knowledge of the effect of a new call or demand service on Autocab and other carriers." Mr. Timothy J. Shwartz is another "one of the qualified individuals" and he will appear and testify and be available for cross examination. There is no reasonable basis for requiring Mr. Vannucci to appear, along with Mr. Schwartz, and testify at the hearing.

² The date of the rescheduled hearing has not been noticed. If Mr. Timothy J. Schwartz is unavailable to appear on the rescheduled date, Protestant Autocab will substitute either Mr. Greg Vannucci or Mr. John A. Schwartz as witness for Protestant Autocab and notify Administrative Law Judge Buckley and Applicant Amigo Cab.

WHEREFORE, for the reasons set forth above, Protestant Autocab, Inc. requests that Administrative Law Judge Barnes deny the Application for Subpoena of Greg Vannucci.
