ANSWER TO LETTER/MOTION FILED BY LACKAWANNA COUNTY

AND NOW, comes the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Transportation ("Department"), by and through its counsel, Nicholas D. Mertens, Assistant Counsel, and states the following in support of its Answer to the Letter/Motion submitted by Lackawanna County ("County") to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission ("Commission") Secretary's Bureau on April 24, 2015:

- On April 9, 2015, the Commission issued an Order establishing a formal investigation into
 the condition and disposition of six (6) highway-rail crossing structures that cross over and
 above the tracks of the Canadian Pacific Railroad in Great Bend Township, New Milford
 Township, Brooklyn Township, Hop Bottom Borough, Lathrop Township, Susquehanna
 County and Benton Township, Lackawanna County.
- 2. The Commission's Order stated that the County, Department, Canadian Pacific Railroad, Norfolk Southern Railway Company (as the current owner of the subject line), Great Bend Township, New Milford Township, Brooklyn Township, Hop Bottom Borough, Lathrop Township, Benton Township, and Susquehanna County are to be made parties to the matter.

- 3. On or about April 24, 2015, the County send a letter, addressed to the Commission's Secretary, objecting to being included as a party in the present matter. A true and correct copy of the County's Letter is attached hereto and marked as "Exhibit A."
- 4. The Department never received a copy of the County's Letter.
- The Department discovered this letter inadvertently while searching through the docket file housed in the Commission's filing room.
- 6. Insomuch as the County's Letter is deemed as a Motion to Dismiss itself as a concerned party in the present matter, the Department files the foregoing Answer.
- As such, the County failed to adhere to the Commission's Rules and Regulations, 52 Pa.
 Code § 1.54, by not serving its Letter/Motion upon all parties hereto.

The County is a Concerned Party to the Formal Investigation

- 8. Paragraphs One (1) through Seven (7) are incorporated herein as if set forth at length.
- The Commission has subject matter jurisdiction over formal investigations pursuant to 66 Pa.C.S. § 331.
- The Commission has the exclusive jurisdiction over the construction, relocation, alteration, suspension, and abolition of highway-rail crossings. 66 Pa.C.S. § 2702.
- 11. Additionally, the Commission has exclusive authority to allocate costs, occasioned by the construction, relocation, alterations, protection, or abolition of public highway-rail crossings, upon specific concerned parties including, but not limited to, municipal corporations. 66 Pa.C.S. § 2704.
- 12. The Commission determines which parties are "concerned" or "interested" within the meaning of 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 2702 and 2704. City of Chester v. Pa. P. U.C., 408 A.2d 552, 553 (Pa. Cmwlth. 1979).

- 13. The Public Utility Code defines "municipal corporation" as "[a]ll cities, boroughs, towns, townships, or counties of this Commonwealth, and also any public corporation, authority, or body whatsoever created or organized under any law of this Commonwealth for the purpose of rendering any service similar to that of a public utility." 66 Pa.C.S. § 102 (emphasis added).
- 14. One (1) of the Six (6) subject crossings is located within Lackawanna County—the County does not dispute this fact.
- 15. The Commission has routinely determined that a county government constitutes a "concerned" party by virtue that a subject crossing is located within its boundaries despite the fact that it does not maintain the subject highway. See City of Chester, 408 A.2d at 554. See also PennDOT v. Pa. P.U.C., 469 A.2d 1149 (Pa. Cmwlth. 1983); In re: Colebrook Road, PUC Docket No. I–00000088, 2010 Pa. PUC LEXIS 1592 (Commission Opinion and Order entered Sept. 17, 2010).
- 16. As such, the County is a concerned party within the meaning of the Public Utility Code and for purposes of the subject formal investigation.

WHEREFORE, the Department of Transportation respectfully requests that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission deny the Letter/Motion, dated April 24, 2015, filed by Lackawanna County in above captioned matter.


Please be advised that we are in receipt of the Administrative Order of April 9, 2015, entered by the PUC in the above referenced matter, wherein Lackawanna County was made a party thereto.

Lackawanna County Objects to it's inclusion as a party in this matter for the following reasons:

- 1. We were not invited to participate in the field investigation held on November 8, 2012;
- The bridge in question is owned by PennDOT, and not Lackawanna County;
- 3. Lackawanna County has no history of performing maintenance or other work to the bridge in question.

Therefore, Lackawanna County demands that it be removed as a party to this matter.

Lastly, the Order was mailed to the attention of Mr. William Jenkins. Be advised that Mr. Jenkins retied as an employee of Lackawanna County in 2004, over 10 years ago, and three Governors ago.
