ANSWER OF COMMUNICATIONS WORKERS OF AMERICA IN OPPOSITION TO MOTION OF VERIZON PENNSYLVANIA LLC TO HOLD SCHEDULING ORDER IN ABEYANCE AND FOR A CONTINUANCE

In accordance with 52 Pa. Code § 5.61, the Communications Workers of America ("CWA") hereby files this Answer in opposition to the Motion to Hold Scheduling Order in Abeyance and for a Continuance filed by Verizon Pennsylvania LLC ("Verizon") on May 6, 2016 (cited herein as "Motion"). As explained below, CWA opposes Verizon's Motion and respectfully requests the Administrative Law Judge to hold the Further Prehearing Conference as scheduled on May 26, 2016. In response to the specific paragraphs of Verizon's Motion, CWA states as follows:

- 1. Admitted in part and denied in part. It is admitted that the pleadings referred to by Verizon were filed on the dates stated. CWA denies that Verizon has accurately summarized those pleadings.
 - 2. Admitted.
- 3. Admitted in part and denied in part. CWA admits that its members began a strike against Verizon on April 13, 2016. CWA lacks knowledge of Verizon's "business continuity plans" and can neither admit nor deny Verizon's averments related to that plan.

By way of further answer, CWA notes that the Commission's regulations require that extensions of time and continuances may be granted only for "good cause shown." 52 Pa. Code § 1.15. CWA denies that Verizon has shown good cause for continuing this proceeding. CWA initiated this proceeding more than seven months ago, raising serious matters that affect public and employee safety. It is long past time for Verizon to be required to respond to CWA's discovery requests and for this matter to move forward through the filing of testimony, hearings, and decision.

For reasons unknown to CWA, Verizon has chosen to use its experienced inhouse legal counsel to perform non-legal tasks during the strike. There is no requirement
that Verizon do so. Indeed, CWA would question the wisdom of removing counsel of
Ms. Paiva's experience from her normal duties to perform work that should be performed
by CWA members.

Moreover, there is no requirement that Verizon be represented in this matter by its in-house counsel. Verizon has often used outside law firms to represent its interests before this Commission. If Verizon makes the business decision to use Ms. Paiva for non-legal duties during the strike, then Verizon should be required to ensure that it remains adequately represented in matters before this Commission by using other counsel. This is particularly important when the proceeding involves matters affecting public and employee safety.

4. Denied. CWA submits that Verizon can "properly prepare a defense" during the strike by allowing people to perform their normal duties for which they are highly trained.

WHEREFORE, CWA respectfully requests the Administrative Law Judge to deny Verizon's request for a continuance. CWA requests the Administrative Law Judge to retain the dates scheduled for the filing of Prehearing Memoranda and the convening of the Further Prehearing Conference.
