# PREHEARING MEMORANDUM OF AQUA PENNSYLVANIA WASTEWATER, INC.

AND NOW, comes Aqua Pennsylvania Wastewater, Inc. ("Aqua") and submits this Prehearing Memorandum in connection with the Initial Prehearing Conference scheduled to be held in the above captioned matter on June 28, 2017.

## I. BACKGROUND

This proceeding concerns the Application of Aqua, filed with the Public Utility Commission ("Commission") on May 19, 2017, for approval of its acquisition of the wastewater system assets of Limerick Township pursuant to Sections 1102 and 1329 of the Public Utility Code.

By Secretarial Letter dated May 31, 2017, the Commission, *inter alia*, acknowledged receipt of the Application and advised that notice of its filing would be published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin on June 10, 2017. The Application was assigned Docket No. A-2017-2605434.

Administrative Law Judge Steven K. Haas was assigned to preside over the proceeding. An Initial Prehearing Conference was noticed for June 28, 2017.

Judge Haas issued a Prehearing Conference Order on June 9, 2017. Paragraph 6 of the Prehearing Conference Order directs parties to file and serve a prehearing memorandum on or before 4:00 PM on June 26, 2017.

## II. LIST OF ISSUES AND AQUA'S POSITION IN REGARD TO THEM

There are two central issues in this Application proceeding:

#### Issue:

Is Aqua's acquisition of the wastewater system assets of Limerick Township necessary or proper for the service, accommodation, convenience or safety of the public?

### Aqua's Position:

Aqua's acquisition of the wastewater system assets of Limerick Township is necessary or proper for the service, accommodation, convenience or safety of the public. The Commission should issue certificate(s) of public convenience approving the acquisition.

As summarized in Section X of the Application:

- a. Aqua has the technical, regulatory, financial and legal fitness to operate the Assets of Limerick Township, and to maintain the operations and make improvements to meet continuing and future customer needs. The proposed transaction will not have an adverse effect on the service provided to existing customers of Aqua;
- b. Limerick Township has agreed to sell its Assets. The public interest and need will be served by allowing Aqua, in lieu of Limerick Township, to provide wastewater service in the Requested Territory and to address the

issues of regulatory requirements and capital expenditures. The Limerick Township system will benefit from the support of wastewater professionals throughout Aqua's organization;

- c. The acquisition is consistent with the Commission's long-standing policy supporting the consolidation/regionalization of water/wastewater systems. Through consolidation/regionalization, the utility industry has a better chance to realize the benefits of better management practices, economies of scale, and the resulting greater environmental/economic benefits. The Commission has previously stated that "acquisitions of smaller systems by larger more viable systems will likely improve the overall long-term viability of the water and wastewater industry." The benefits of consolidation/regionalization, ultimately, inure to customers both existing and acquired;
- d. Aqua provides utility service to approximately 20,000 wastewater customers and has years of experience operating wastewater treatment and collection systems in a safe, reliable and efficient manner. Aqua has the managerial, technical, and financial resources to improve the operations of the Township;
- e. The acquisition will not have any immediate impact on the rates of either the Township customers or the existing customers of Aqua. Notably, Aqua has not had a base rate increase since 2010; and
- f. The acquisition of the Limerick Sewer system will increase Aqua's customer base by approximately 27%. With a larger customer base, future infrastructure investments, Statewide, will be shared at a lower incremental cost per customer for all Aqua customers. The acquisition, moreover, comes with the expectation of future growth. Future growth will spread the cost of service across even more customers, further improving economies of scale.

### Issue:

Pursuant to Section 1329 of the Public Utility Code, what is the ratemaking rate base of the wastewater system assets of Limerick Township?

#### Aqua's Position:

The ratemaking rate base determined pursuant to Section 1329(c)(2) of the Public Utility Code is \$75,100,000, being the lesser of the purchase price of \$75,100,000 negotiated by Aqua and Limerick Township and the average of the fair market value appraisals which is \$78,494,000 – determined by \$80,098,000 (rounded) presented in the appraisal of Gannett Fleming Valuation and Rate Consultants,

LLC ("Gannett Fleming") and \$76,890,000 presented in the appraisal of Herbert, Rowland & Grubic ("HRG").

#### III. WITNESSES

The written direct testimony of William C. Packer and Mark J. Bubel, Sr., in support of the Application and the determination of the ratemaking rate base was attached as Exhibits U and Exhibit V, respectively, to the Application when it was submitted to the Commission on May 19, 2017.
