PROTEST

Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code Sections 5.51, et seq. and 66 Pa. C. S. Sections 1101, et. seq., Colt and Kristyn Martin files this Protest to the Independence Energy Connection-West. In support of this Protest, Colt and Kristyn avers as follows:

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- 2. We are homeowners along the proposed main route, of which part of our privately-owned land would likely need to be given for a portion of the needed right of way.
- 3. We have multiple concerns that have surfaced regarding this transmission line project since it has been brought to our attention including: health of our young, growing family; property values for our home and our neighbors'; aesthetics and sightlines; and continued maintenance of the line;
- 4. When we first received notice of the project potentially being near our property, we researched the effects of EMFs/high transmission lines on the health of children, being that our first daughter was born in October 2017. While most health-related data is deemed "inconclusive", the overwhelming majority Sources:

of articles/studies state there is a definite link between childhood leukemia and proximity to high voltage transmission (HVT) lines. Most concerning is the statistic that there is a 70% increase¹ in a child's likelihood of being diagnosed with leukemia if they live within a 200-meter distance of a HVT line.

Our second concern was property values of our own home and our neighbors' along with the rest of those affected in our region. Kristyn is a licensed real estate broker and practices the business daily in Franklin County as our family's sole source of income. She has been licensed since 2010. Her professional opinion is that placing HVT lines of this size (135' tall) will be an extreme deterrent to a buyer in our area. There are already property owners listing their homes for sale, trying to get out before their values take a greater hit, even with the project not yet having received final approvals. With the project being solely suggested to be a cost savings project, devaluation of properties where new lines are constructed needs to be considered. What is intended to save some rate payers a few dollars over 15 years, may concurrently cause immediate property value loss estimated between 4-7%² to others.

In 2016 we built our family's home on our 3-acre property in rural Franklin County with the intent of living here our entire lives. We were even married in the backyard because we could not think of a more beautiful setting. The gorgeous mountainous backdrop we had for our wedding would now be marred by the unsightliness of HVT lines.

Last, but certainly not least, the concern of maintenance of the line is an issue since Transource, LLC would be the company in charge of maintaining the line and they are a new company³ without a proven history of being able to maintain the powerlines. While longer standing parent companies AEP and Great Plains are the two entities with ownership of the LLC, if the perceived need (since this is only to relieve congestion of the grid, not to bring power to an area) for the transmission lines subsides due to the ongoing efforts of private owners to generate their own power sources via solar, wind, etc., Transource, Sources:

WHEREFORE, Colt and Kristyn Martin respectfully requests the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission not to approve Docket No. A-2017-2640200 and to investigate and hold full hearings locally regarding the filing.
