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**PETITION OF RETAIL ENERGY SUPPLY ASSOCIATION FOR  
LEAVE TO WITHDRAW INTERVENTION**

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Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.94, the Retail Energy Supply Association (“RESA”)<sup>1</sup>, respectfully requests that Honorable Administrative Law Elizabeth Barnes grant this Petition for Leave to Withdraw RESA’s Petition to Intervene. In support thereof, RESA states as follows:

1. On March 25, 2020, PPL Electric Utilities Corporation (“PPL”) for Approval of a Default Service Program and Procurement Plan for the Period June 1, 2021 Through May 31, 2025 (“DSP Petition”) proposing to establish the terms and conditions under which it will procure default service supplies, provide default service to non-shopping customers, satisfy requirements imposed by the Alternative Energy Portfolio Standards Act (“AEPS Act”)<sup>2</sup> and recover all associated costs on a full and current basis.
2. On May 6, 2020, RESA filed both a Petition to Intervene and a Prehearing Memorandum.
3. A prehearing conference was held on May 15, 2020 and, pursuant to Procedural Order dated May 15, 2020, RESA’s Petition to Intervene was granted.

4. Since that time, RESA has continued to evaluate PPL's proposals, issued discovery requests and reviewed the discovery responses that have been served to date. By letter dated June 9, 2020, RESA provided notice of its intent to present the testimony of Daniel Allegretti on its behalf.

5. Following this notice, RESA re-evaluated its ability to pursue its interests in this proceeding and has determined that it no longer wishes to incur the time and expense involved with being an active party to this case.

6. No party will be harmed by RESA's withdrawal from these proceedings as RESA has not served direct testimony nor has it actively participated in any informal settlement negotiations among the parties.

7. Permitting a party to withdraw from a proceeding when it no longer wishes to pursue its claims is in the public interest because it promotes judicial economy and streamlines the processing of the case.

**WHEREFORE**, the Retail Energy Supply Association respectfully requests that the Honorable Elizabeth Barnes grant this Petition for Leave to Withdraw the RESA's Petition to Intervene and permit RESA to withdraw its participation as an active party in this proceeding.
