Dear Ms. Chiavetta:

On October 1, 2020, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) issued a Secretarial Letter with directives for all electric, natural gas, water, wastewater, and telecommunications utilities to comply with a temporary reporting requirement. Specifically, the Commission requested that utilities report the following regarding their customers at risk of termination:

- Total number of Residential and Non-Residential accounts at risk of termination at the end of the month and for the same month the year prior.
- Total aggregate dollars of arrears, broken down by the same account categories, at the end of the month and for the same month the year prior.

In accordance with the Secretarial Letter, PECO submits the information included with this letter as PECO Attachment I.
