NOTICE OF PROPOSED RATE CHANGES

To Our Customers:

UGI Electric is filing a request with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PUC) to increase your electric rates as of April 9, 2021. This notice describes the company's rate request, the PUC's role, and what actions you can take.

UGI Electric has requested an overall rate increase of \$8.709 million per year. If the company's entire request is approved, the total bill for a residential customer using 1,000 kilowatt-hours (kWh) per month and receiving default service from the company would increase from \$110.18 to \$123.83 per month or by 12.4%.

The total bill for a small commercial customer using 1,000 kWh per month and receiving default service from the company would increase from \$120.40 to \$135.62 per month or by 12.6%.

The total bill for an industrial customer using 50,000 kWh per month and receiving default service from the company would decrease from \$3,931,30 to \$3,897,36 per month or by 0.9%.

To find out your customer class or how the requested increase may affect your electric bill, contact UGI Electric at 1-800-276-2722. The rates requested by the company may be found in proposed Supplement No. 26 to UGI Electric Tariff No. 6 and proposed Supplement No. 2 to UGI Electric Tariff No. 25. You may examine the material filed with the PUC which explains the requested increase and the reasons for it. A copy of this material is kept at the UGI Electric Office. Upon request, the company will send you the Statement of Reasons for proposed Supplement No. 26 to UGI Electric Tariff No. 6 and proposed Supplement No. 2 to UGI Electric Tariff No. 25, explaining why the rate increase has been requested.

The state agency which approves rates for public utilities is the PUC. The PUC will examine the requested rate increase and can prevent existing rates from changing until it investigates and/or holds hearings on the request. The company must prove that the requested rates are reasonable. After examining the evidence, the PUC may grant all, some, or none of the request or may reduce existing rates.

The PUC may change the amount of the rate increase or decrease requested by the utility for each customer class. As a result, the rate charged to you may be different than the rate requested by the company and shown above.

There are three ways to challenge a company's request to change its rates:

- 1. You can file a formal complaint. If you want a hearing before a judge, you must file a formal complaint. By filing a formal complaint, you assure yourself the opportunity to take part in hearings about the rate increase request. All complaints should be filed with the PUC before April 9, 2021. If no formal complaints are filed, the Commission may grant all, some, or none of the request without holding a hearing before a judge.
- 2. You can send us a letter telling why you object to the requested rate increase. Sometimes there is information in these letters that makes us aware of problems with the company's service or management. This information can be helpful when we investigate the rate request. Send your letter or request for a formal complaint form to The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, Post Office Box 3265, Harrisburg, PA 17105-3265.
- 3. You can be a witness at a public input hearing. Public input hearings are held if the Commission opens an investigation of the company's rate increase requested and if there is a large number of customers interested in the case. At these hearings you have the opportunity to present your views in person of the PUC judge hearing the case and the company representatives. All testimony given "under oath" becomes part of the official rate case record. These hearings are held in the service area of the company.


