PREHEARING MEMORANDUM OF THE BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION AND ENFORCEMENT

TO THE HONORABLE CHRISTOPER P. PELL:

In accordance with the Prehearing Conference Order issued on April 20, 2022, the

Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (I&E) of the Pennsylvania Public Utility

Commission (Commission) respectfully submits the following Prehearing Memorandum

in the above-captioned proceeding.

I. BACKGROUND

On March 18, 2022, Columbia Gas of Pennsylvania, Inc. (Columbia or Company) filed with the Commission proposed Tariff Gas – Pa. P.U.C. No. 9 (Tariff No. 9). Tariff No. 9 contained rates rules and regulations designed to increase its annual distribution revenues by \$82.2 million. Tariff No. 9 has a proposed an effective date of May 17, 2022.

At Public Meeting on April 14, 2022, the Commission stated that pursuant to 66 Pa. C.S. § 1308(d), the filing will be suspended by operation of law until December 17, 2022, unless permitted by Commission Order to become effective at an earlier date. The case was subsequently assigned to the Officer of Administrative Law Judge (OALJ) for the development of an evidentiary record including a Recommended Decision. The OALJ assigned the suspended proceeding to Deputy Chief Administrative Law Judge Christopher P. Pell (ALJ Pell) for investigation and scheduling of hearings to consider the lawfulness, justness and reasonableness of the Company's Rate increase request. A Prehearing Conference has been scheduled for April 29, 2022. I&E filed its Notice of Appearance on March 22, 2022.

II. ISSUES

Based upon a preliminary review of the filing, I&E has identified certain areas of inquiry. The following statement of areas of inquiry represents the potential issues in this proceeding at this time and is as complete as I&E is currently able to make the list of issues. However, I&E specifically reserves the right to address such other issues should

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other issues arise during the course of this proceeding:

- a) Overall Rate of Return including: Cost of Debt Cost of Common Equity Capital Structure Management Performance
- b) Rate Structure/Rate Design including: Customer Charges/Customer Cost Analysis
- c) Rate Base including: Test Year plant balance comparisons Future Test Year and Fully Projected Future Test Year Reports Amortizations included in annual depreciation Rate Base additions and deductions Utility Plant in Service Accumulated Depreciation Annual Depreciation Expense Materials and Supplies
- d) Cost of Service
- e) Revenue including: Customer cost projections Usage per customer projections Appropriate treatment of flex rate revenue Forfeited Discounts Miscellaneous Service Revenue Rent from Gas Property Revenue Normalization Adjustment
- f) Operation and Maintenance Expense Claims including: Labor Expense Incentive Compensation Other Employee Benefits Outside Service Corporate Insurance Injuries and Damages Materials and Supplies NCSC Expense Rate Case Expense Uncollectible Accounts

COVID-19 Deferral Total Rider USP Interest on Customer Deposits Rate Base – Prepayments Other O&M

- g) Tariff Changes
- h) Other: Lost and Unaccounted for Gas
- i) Pipeline Safety Issues: LTIIP Goals Priority Pipe Materials Leak Rate per Mile Contractor Issues

Most of the issues raised by I&E will be supported by the Direct Testimony of an I&E witness in his or her area of responsibility. However, there may be issues of Commission policy or legal interpretation that are not properly the subject of testimony; or there may be factual issues that are clear on the record and need not be supported by testimony. I&E reserves the right to dispense with testimony when, in its opinion, an issue can be adequately addressed in Brief.

V. PUBLIC INPUT HEARINGS

To the extent that Public Input Hearings are deemed necessary in this proceeding I&E requests that Public Input Hearings be held electronically or telephonically.

VI. SETTLEMENT

I&E intends to participate in any settlement discussions and is willing to reach a resolution of any or all issues. However, a discussion of issues that may be settled is not possible until further discovery has been conducted and the positions of the other parties are known.

VII. DISCOVERY

Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §§5.322 and 5.331(b), discovery has begun and is ongoing. I&E requests that the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure for the conduct of discovery be modified as follows:

- Answers to written interrogatories shall be served in-hand within ten (10) calendar days of service.
- Objections to interrogatories shall be communicated orally within three (3) calendar days of service; unresolved objections shall be served in writing within five (5) calendar days of service of interrogatories.
- Motions to dismiss objections and/or direct the answering of interrogatories shall be filed within three (3) calendar days of service of written objections.
- Answers to motions to dismiss objections and/or direct the answering of interrogatories shall be filed within three (3) calendar days of service of such motions.
- 5. Discovery served after 12:00 noon on a Friday or after 12:00 p.m. on any business day preceding a state holiday will be deemed to be served on the next business day.

VIII. SERVICE OF DOCUMENTS

For purposes of satisfying in-hand requirements for discovery responses, prepared testimony, and briefs during the closure of Commission offices, and consistent with the

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provisions of the Commission's September 15, 2021 Order for Waiver of Regulations Regarding Service Requirements,¹ I&E proposes to both only serve and accept electronic delivery of documents.
