GLOSE MOVING AND STORAGE, INC. @ A-00094076 has applied its local hourly rates from Transportation Rate Table GG found in Tariff Freight Pa. P.U.C. No. 50 (50-T) issued by Tristate Household Goods Tariff Conference, Inc., Agent.

For calendar year Glose Moving and Storage, Inc. generated total revenues of \$5,690,300 and expenses of \$5,617,540, or an operating ration of 98.7%. Of that total revenues only \$1,418,695 applied to the transportation of household goods in use.

Also attached is a Wage Cost Study Form prepared by Glose Movign and Storage, Inc. which reflects an increase in wages and fringe benefits from 2011 to 2013 of 9.9%.

The proposed increase in hourly rates is 3.2%
