

(a) TRISTATE HOUSEHOLD GOODS CONFERENCE, INC., MEMBERS IN BERKS COUNTY **INCREASE IN RATES**

(b) Tristate Household Goods Tariff Conference, Inc. (Tristate) has filed 7th Revised Page 76 to Tariff Freight Pa. PUC No. 50 on June 5, 2006 and proposes a total increase in revenues of \$16,577 to cover increased wage and fringe benefits for carriers in Berks County. The current rates have been in effect since December 6, 2004. Tristate proposes to increase the hourly 3 men and vehicle normal complement charge by 3.2%. The current hourly rate for Berks County is \$108.50 per hour. Tristate proposes increasing this rate to \$112 per hour. Glose Moving & Storage, Inc. and L & J Moving & Storage, Inc. are the affected carriers. Tristate has submitted documentation supporting the proposed increase indicating that it is necessary to cover the cost of operating. Employee wages and fringe benefits have increased by 12.3% from \$24.25 per hour in 2004 to \$27.23 per hour in 2006.

(c) The data compiled and submitted by the carrier supports this increase and the Bureau recommends that 7th Revised Page 76 to Tariff Freight Pa. PUC No. 50 be approved to become effective August 21, 2006.

ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

Tristate Household Goods Tariff Conference, Inc. (Tristate) has filed a 7th Revised Page 76 to Tariff Freight Pa. PUC No. 50 on June 5, 2006 and proposes a total increase in revenues of \$16,577 to cover increased wage and fringe benefit expenses for carriers in Berks County. The current rates have been in effect since December 6, 2004.

Tristate proposes to increase the hourly 3 men and vehicle normal complement charge by 3.2%. The current hourly rate for Berks County is \$108.50 per hour. Tristate proposes increasing this rate to \$112 per hour.

Glose Moving & Storage, Inc. and L & J Moving & Storage, Inc. are the affected carriers that are subject to the 6th Revised Page 76 to Tariff Freight Pa. PUC No. 50 for Berks County.

Tristate has submitted a wage/fringe benefit and insurance cost study for Berks County in support of the proposed hourly increase indicating that the increase is necessary to cover the cost of operating. Employee wages and fringe benefits have increased by 12.3% from \$24.25 per hour in 2004 to \$27.23 per hour in 2006.

<u>ANALYSIS</u>

In order to generate this revenue increase, Tristate proposes to increase the 3 men and vehicle normal complement by 3.2% from a charge of \$108.50 per hour to \$112 per hour. We conclude that the data compiled and submitted by the carrier supports this increase.

CONCLUSION

We have determined that Tristate has submitted the documentary justification to support the proposed revenue increase of \$16,577 and that the increase is not an excessive amount based on the increase in operating expenses. We believe that the increase will be sufficient for the carriers to provide safe, dependable and continuous service to the public: THEREFORE,
