(a) Application of Keystone Relocation, LLC, a limited liability company of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Centre County, Pennsylvania, for the additional right to transport, as a common carrier, by motor vehicle, household goods in use, from points in Centre County to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa; which is to be a transfer of the rights authorized under the certificate issued at A-00089650, F. 2, Am-E to Williamsport Moving Company, Inc., t/a Keystone Relocation, subject to the same limitations and conditions.

(b) The application was filed November 18, 2005. Public notice of the application was given in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* of January 28, 2006, with protests due by February 21, 2006. No protests were filed and no hearings were held. The unopposed application is certified to the Commission for its decision without oral hearing. A review of the record indicates that the applicant possesses the technical expertise, experience, equipment, facilities, sufficient capital and other resources necessary to provide the proposed service.

ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter comes before the Commission on an application filed November 18, 2005. Public notice of the application was given in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* of January 28, 2006, with protests due by February 21, 2006. No protests were filed and no hearings were held. The unopposed application is certified to the Commission for its decision without oral hearing.

DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

Keystone Relocation, LLC (applicant) currently holds authority to transport property, excluding household goods in use, between points in Pennsylvania at A-00121721, Folder 1. Applicant conducts operations from its facilities at 2929 Stewart Drive, Suite 103, State College, Centre County.

The applicant is seeking the grant of authority to transport household goods in use through a transfer of that authority from Williamsport Moving Company, Inc., t/a Keystone Relocation (transferor), which is currently authorized to provide that service. In an effort to serve shippers in the service territory more effectively, transferor desires to transfer the authority to the newly organized applicant. The intrastate operating authority is being sold for \$50,000.

Robert J. McKernan, Jr., president and owner of Keystone Relocation, LLC, is also president and owner of the transferor. His experience in the moving industry is extensive and spans a period of 25 years.

Applicant will operate five straight trucks and five tractor-trailer combinations and will lease additional vehicles when needed. In addition to possessing the essential equipment, applicant also has achieved a satisfactory rating on its safety fitness review.

The applicant reports total current assets of \$18,792 and total liabilities of \$46, for owner's equity of \$18,746.

The authority to be transferred has been operated by the transferor; therefore, it is presumed that there is a continuing need, which may be overcome only by evidence to the contrary. In re: Byerly, 270 A.2d 186 (Pa. 1970); Hostetter v. Pa. P.U.C., 49 A.2d 862 (Pa. Super 1947). Since the record is void of any such evidence, this presumption of continuing public need applies in this transfer proceeding.

After complete review of the record, we find:

1. The applicant has the experience, equipment and financial fitness to provide the proposed service.
2. Approval of the unopposed application is necessary for the continued accommodation and convenience of the public:

THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED: That the unopposed application be and is hereby approved granting the following right:

To transport household goods in use between points in Centre County, and from points in said County to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the applicants shall not provide any Service granted in this order until the following is submitted to the Commission:

1. Form E evidence of Bodily Injury and Property Damage Liability Insurance.
2. Form H evidence of Cargo Liability Insurance
2. A tariff establishing just and reasonable rates.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That upon compliance with the requirements herein before set forth, a certificate shall issue evidencing the Commission's approval of the right to operate as above determined.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That in the event said applicants have not, on or before sixty (60) days from the date of entry of this order, complied with the requirements hereinbefore set forth, the application shall be dismissed without further proceedings.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That you must demonstrate safety fitness by completing a Safety Fitness Review. You will be contacted by the Commission's Bureau of Transportation and Safety, which will schedule a review to be completed within 180 days of the date your certificate is issued. Failure to submit to a Safety Fitness Review or to attain a satisfactory evaluation will result in cancellation of the certificate.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That upon compliance with the requirements of this order, the authority granted to Williamsport Moving Company, Inc., t/a Keystone Relocation, under the certificates issued at A-00089650, F. 2, Am-E, shall be cancelled and the records be marked closed.
